	<ul> <li>Actions:</li> <li>Jo McBride explained there is a meeting with the national team to get more intelligence about the commissioning of level 2 beds, and will update the group – To be discussed as part of service development monies</li> <li>Guidelines ratification - Lucy Allton will share the process when finalised – To be discussed in meeting</li> <li>Jo McBride commented that on all the site visits, CAMHS is an issue that has been consistently raised. There are a number of different staffing models/staff support systems; the ODN team will speak to these trusts to share the information – ODN will collate information and share, also plan to have a session at future meeting</li> <li>If anyone has any information on the Fabian ventilator, please send to Jon McViety and Paul Langridge – Jon not present today</li> <li>Helen Coutts asked to be added to the pressure gauge distribution list. 	NWTS update given by Suzy Emsden:  NWTS update for PCC ODN August 20	
4.	National Update	
	Lucy gave the update from the National ODN meeting: - All areas very busy	

- National occupancy on DoS has been 90%+ consistently
- Surgery waiting list recovery is slower for children than for adults
- Elective recovery hampered by level of PIC activity
- Service development money allocated to each region based on population and deprivation; money to be used for transport and level 2/surge
- DoS changes went live on Monday
- RSV numbers seemed to have levelled, and hospitalisations have decreased over last couple of weeks, although need to see impact of children returning to school
- Hepatitis numbers have now decreased, and hepatitis cell has been stood down
- The NW surge plan has been submitted

- Data analyst now in post. Working to get a dashboard established to look at HDU/PCC activity.

#### **Tertiary Centres**

#### RMCH

- Continue to be very busy; Compared to 2020, PICU activity up 47% and HDU activity up 10%. Large increase in LTV patients, up 300%.
- Decrease in elective surgery patients being able to get onto PICU, due to increase in admissions
- Currently in discussions with commissioners re pressures

#### AHCH

- Intermittently busy, particularly on HDU
- Staffing has been a challenge, but some new nurses getting into the numbers which is positive
- Had a nurse recruitment event for PICU a few weeks ago, which appeared to go well

#### N Wales, IOM

#### IoM

- Staffing issues
- Lots of HDU patients, but only 2 that had to go up to ICU

#### Glan Clywd

- Activity steady
- A couple of patients transferred to PICU for prolonged seizures / blocked shunts
- Some nursing shortages, but have some new nurses who are getting their competencies up ready for winter

#### L&SC

#### MBHT

- Ongoing building work at both sites
- Several high acuity patients at Lancaster
- At Furness, not quite as busy, but staffing/recruitment an issue

#### Blackpool

- High inpatient numbers
- Mixture of patients, seeing some RSV
- Received some NWTS input
- Patient passed away after paracetamol overdose
- A patient with non-accidental injury suffering seizures transferred out
- Seeing increase in mental health admissions
- Had flurry of staff covid sickness, but this has improved
- New staff getting trained up for winter
- Newly qualified staff to start in September

#### ELHT

- Have been stable at around 2 covid patients at any one time
- Seeing increase in newly diagnosed diabetic patients; peak of 7 patients one month, difficult for staff to manage
- HDU numbers stable at around 2-5 per day
- Catching up on staff training; APLS delayed during covid and getting back up and running with AHCH HDU course
- Struggling in terms of middle grade cover; locum spending high

Have recruited 3 trainee Advanced Clinical Practitioner posts

#### C&M

#### Overview from Kim Williams

- Activity not too bad
- HDU capacity good in the DGHs
- Main issue is significantly higher CAMHS admissions, and delayed discharges to social care
- Nursing staffing issues, mainly due to covid, and some very junior workforces in some DGHs

#### Chester

- Issues with junior staff and resilience and morale

#### Warrington

- Issues with CAMHS and safeguarding patients
- Staffing issues; recruiting nurses at present
- New member of staff to the safeguarding team with social care background who will support with the complex discharges

#### <u>GM</u>

#### Bolton

- RSV numbers peaked in week 19/20, so not as high as July as last year
- Ward busy, although fluctuates through the week
- Had support from NWTS this morning
- 3 HDU patients at present
- Currently doing winter surge planning
- Some staff off with covid in last month
- Issues with medical staffing

#### Stockport

- Inpatient numbers up and down
- Thanks to NWTS for their support and the transfer out of 2 patients on the same day
- Have done winter escalation plan

#### Oldham

- Ricky Barber introduced himself as the new ward manager at Oldham. Will give update at the next meeting.
